
## **QUORN SWIMMING POOL**

# Opening Day Souvenir



## The Quorn Swimming Pool

In December 1970 a public meeting was held at the Rawlins School to discuss the possibility of raising money to build a swimming pool for Quorn. The meeting was addressed by Mr. Mallory, the Principal of Hind Leys School and Community College, Shepshed, who described how Shepshed had built its pool and its cost. The meeting decided to set up a Committee under the aegis of the Rawlins Community College for the purpose of giving Quorn a pool on the Rawlins site.

In January 1971 a committee was formed representative of various local groups in Quorn and its first meeting was held in February. Policy was worked out, i.e. that we should build in stages, an open pool being the first stage, to be used by St. Bartholomew's School and Rawlins School by day in term time and available for the general public at other times, and various schemes for raising money were suggested and later implemented.

Towards the end of 1972 it was clear that building costs were rising so fast that we must act quickly and tenders were obtained from a number of firms for a 25 metre pool. These showed that we should be between four and five thousand pounds short, but fortunately we were able to obtain interest free loans from a number of private individuals and the remainder from the County Council, with the help of people willing to guarantee the loan; and to all these people we are extremely indebted. The tender of Home Pools Ltd., Oadby, for £18,248 was accepted in Spring 1973. We were fortunate to have the help of a member of the committee, Mr. Geoffrey Potter, the County Surveyor, and of the County Architect's staff, in vetting and negotiating tenders.

The pool was built during the Autumn Term of 1973, and we had an 'unofficial' opening on the last Saturday in October, when a number of children and a smaller number of adults had a rather chilly but very gay, free swim.

In the early part of 1974 a Management Committee, representative of local interests, was set up under the chairmanship of Mr. Andrew Hunt, Principal of Rawlins School and Community College. We are grateful that the Chairman of the Parish Council and a representative of the Charnwood District Council are among those who have agreed to serve on this committee, which will organise the public use of the pool.

## Acknowledgements

The Swimming Pool Committee in the last three years has organised a number of money-making events and is grateful for the support it has received from people in Quorn and to the shop-keepers who have displayed our posters and made us gifts.

We are grateful, too, to the following organisations which have raised money for us: The Festival Players (Loughborough); the Jean Kent School of Dancing; the Leicester Magic Circle; Pearl's Ltd., Loughborough, (Fashion Shows); Quorn Football Club; Quorn Charities Darts League; Quorn Guides and Brownies. We especially wish to thank all those individuals who have organised events and helped in any way.

The pupils and staff of St. Bartholomew's School who organised a sponsored swim and a concert, and of the Rawlins School who organised three sponsored walks have raised over £3,000.

We would thank, also, those who have joined the 150 Club, and those in Quorn, Anstey and other villages who were agents for or members of the Tote.

### The Future

#### The Immediate Future

- 1. There is still a debt of just over £2,000 remaining, and we must hope for further donations and continued support to repay this in the next year or so.
- 2. The Management Committee is still anxious to hear of more people willing to act as attendants and stewards during the public sessions of the pool.

#### The more Long-term Future

The cost of covering the pool, so that it can be used all the year round, and of building separate changing accommodation will clearly be beyond the resources of the present Fund Raising Committee; and we must hope that at some future time public funds will be made available for this purpose.

The best way in which the people of Quorn and district can help is by using the pool frequently and responsibly, so that the need for spending public money to complete the work becomes strongly felt.

## Use of Pool

Use of the pool by members of the public will be permitted outside normal school hours i.e., at the following times:

 Monday to Friday
 5.30 p.m. - 7 p.m.
 7.30 p.m. - 9 p.m.

 Saturdays
 10.30 a.m. - 12.30 p.m.
 1.30 p.m. - 3.30 p.m.

 4.30 p.m. - 6.30 p.m.
 7.00 p.m. - 9.00 p.m.

At all times the continued use of the pool, either generally or specifically, will be at the discretion of the Pool Supervisor.

MEMBERSHIP is open to anyone in Quorn or the immediate neighbourhood who cares to apply

Use of the pool will be restricted to members of the Quorn Swimming Pool Club at the following charges:

Children (8-16 years) 10p per season. Adults 20p per season.

Children under 8 years of age accompanied by an adult member do not need a membership card.

Membership cards may be obtained at Rawlins School Office, the Community College Office or the Pool Office during swimming sessions.

## NO PERSON WILL BE ADMITTED TO THE POOL WITHOUT PRODUCTION OF HIS OR HER CARD

#### SESSION CHARGES

The following charges will be made for each session of pool use:

Weekdays Adults - 10p.

Children 8-16 years - 5p.

Weekends Adults - 15p.

Children 8-16 years - 5p.

No charge will be made for children under 8 years of age who are accompanied by an adult member of the Swimming Pool Club.
